

President's Message

Dear Genetics Section Members,

I'm looking forward to the upcoming annual meeting in Lake Placid, now about five weeks away. The annual meeting is often held in some pretty neat locations, but in 2005 and 2006 I think we're getting to enjoy two of the best: Alaska and the Adirondacks. The Adirondacks are, of course, a national treasure, and the meeting appears to be shaping up nicely. The Section is co-sponsoring two symposia at this year's meeting. These symposia are "Risks to Migratory Life Histories of Trout and Char: A Call for Research, Assessment and Conservation," and "The Role of Hybridization in Evolution, Ecology, and Conservation of Fishes." The migratory life history session is being organized by Kitty Griswold (current Section Secretary-Treasurer), Robert Gresswell, Jack Williams, and Jason Dunham; and the hybridization session is being organized by Ed Heist (Section President-Elect) and me (current Section President). The winners are identified in this newsletter, below. I'm grateful to the members of both award committees for their efforts in evaluating all the excellent submissions this year. Please consider joining one of these committees in the future; it's a fun and rewarding experience. I will make the 2006 award announcements at our **annual Section meeting** in Lake Placid, which will be held from **3 to 5pm, Sunday, 10 September**, in the Grandview B room of the Crowne Plaza Hotel. I hope to see you there.

Section members have voted in a **new President-Elect and Secretary—Treasurer**. Nominating Committee chair Lisa Seeb counted a total of 26 members that contributed mail-in ballots for this election by the 15 July deadline. The election results are summarized in this newsletter, below. I will announce these election results at the Section meeting in Lake Placid on 10 September.

We're always interested in your comments on Section elections and ways to improve the process. Based on several requests and an unofficial canvassing of Section members, I will be asking the AFS Governing Board at their annual meeting in Lake Placid to amend the Section's by-laws to permit electronic voting, which will help to increase participation in the process. Graduate Student Assistantship Available

Graduate Position – Sturgeon Genetics: A Ph.D. research assistantship including stipend and tuition waiver is available to begin January 2007 in the laboratory of Dr. Ed Heist at Southern Illinois University Carbondale (SIUC) in collaboration with Dr. David Galat at the University of Missouri. The project will involve development of Single Nucleotide Polymorphism (SNP) markers in river sturgeons of the genus *Scaphirhychus* in relation to conservation of the endangered pallid sturgeon (*S. albus*). This project will form part of a doctoral dissertation in the Department of Zoology (http://www.science.siu.edu/zoology/) in conjunction with the Fisheries and Illinois Aquaculture Center (http://fisheries.siu.edu/). The ideal candidate will have prior experience with molecular genetics techniques (e.g. DNA sequencing and/or cDNA library construction) and will have an interest in the use of molecular genetics in conservation and fisheries management.
