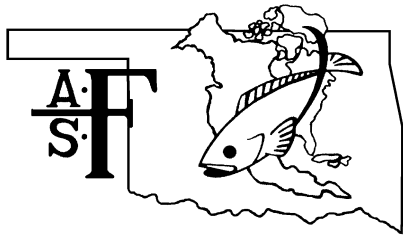

13th ANNUAL FISHERIES TECHNIQUES DEMONSTRATION

Each Spring the OSU student subunit picks an area reservoir where we hold a demonstration showing students different types of sampling gear and giving students the opportunity to have some hands on experience with these different gear types. We invite both fisheries and wildlife students from universities statewide to this event. Typically Northeastern State University, Southeastern Oklahoma State University, and Oklahoma State University students make up the bulk of the attendees. Hopefully this year we will be able to persuade students from other universities who are interested in fisheries to attend.

The OSU subunit officers are currently planning this year's fisheries techniques demo. The plans have not finalized yet but here is what we've come up with so far. As of now we are planning on having the demo on Saturday, March 29th at a centrally located lake (yet to be determined). Since it was held at Lake Texoma last year we thought we would be a little kinder to the folks from NSU this time and make their commute a little shorter.

At this year's demo students will gain experience with electrofishing, backpack electrofishing, trapnets, hoopnets, seining, tagging, aging, as well as other fisheries gear. Students will rotate through different stations learning about and using each type of gear. There will be cook out style lunch with a guest speaker who is a professional in the field of fisheries. The cost is only \$5.00 and that covers attending the demo, lunch, as well as membership dues for Oklahoma Student Chapter of the American Fisheries Society.

We will send out emails when the date and location has been finalized. We hope to see you there!

Jimmie will always be remembered as a dedicated professional and active fisheries conservationist who loved his work and his students.

Any student who is active in fisheries or a related aquatic discipline is eligible to apply. Recipients are selected by the Chapter Nominating and Awards Committee and are presented the award at the annual Chapter business meeting. Selection is based on academic qualifications, professional service, contribution to fisheries and the applicant's demonstrated desire and need for the grant.

Awards are based on merit and are not necessarily given each year. 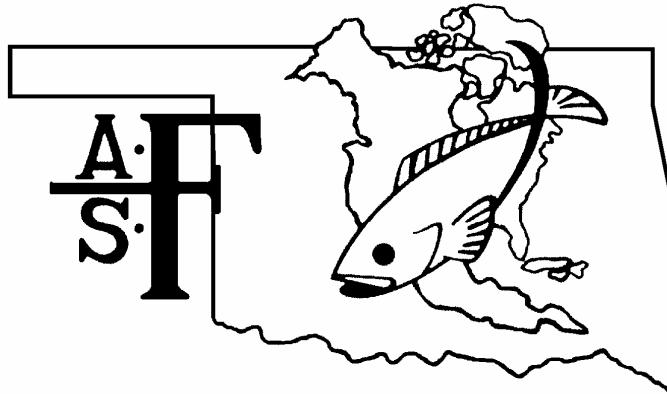
